- Completing reporting and planning requirements.
- Actively promoting the program within the community.
- Building capacity of parents to take on some of the program responsibilities.

The successful applicant will have:

- Strong communication and conflict resolution skills.
- Previous experience working with children aged 0-5 in an early education or care facility is highly desirable.
- High ethical standards and self-motivation.

### **3a Learning Assistant**

Some of the duties you will be required to carry out include:

- Assisting parents and children to complete education play activities.
- Help keep records of children attending the centre.
- Clean and store all equipment and supplies at the end of each day.

**To be considered for this position you will have a basic knowledge of learning games and conversational reading; and exceptional communication skills.**
